HIRUNDO WILDLIFE REFUGE 394-4681

This wildlife refuge is a 2,605-acre tract of land donated to the University of Maine by Oliver Larouche. Its meadows, woodlands, stream banks, and four-acre pond are home to hundreds of different kinds of birds, flora, and fauna. The refuge is an important site for university field study, research projects, and an ongoing archaeological dig. Visitors are welcome to go hiking, canoeing, and cross-country skiing. Camping, snowmobiling, motor boating, hunting, or trapping are not allowed. Groups are encouraged to call in advance. Cost: Free. The refuge is supported solely by donations.

The Museum has become home for the state's most important collection of farm technologies and artifacts of rural culture. The Museum assures that future generations will be able to gain valuable and practical insights into Maine's rural past. The Museum offers a variety of educational programs for young people from preschool to college age, the largest proportion coming from area public schools. Free admission.
